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

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
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STEM CAREERS CONFERENCE




All other jewellery including bracelets, necklaces, and rings must also not be brought to school. If seen these will be confiscated in the first instance and collected from your Pastoral Leader at the end of the day. Repeated failure to follow this rule will result in further behaviour sanctions being issued.

We do however encourage our students to **wear a watch** for school to ensure they are punctual to all events. Good time keeping is a key skill to develop and take into their future life.

General Appearance – A reminder to all students that all make-up, including fake-tan, lash extensions, false nails and painted nails are not permitted in school under any circumstances. If students are to wear these for events outside of school such as dance competitions, weddings or family celebrations they should be booked for the day the student finishes school and removed by the time they return.

Attendance Matters - Attendance and punctuality to school and lessons is paramount to successful outcomes. The graphic below clearly shows the impact being off school can have upon your child's progress.



At EPCHS we will support, but never tolerate poor attendance and as five weeks of the school year have passed, our attendance phone calls, home visits, parental meetings and legal referrals will begin as ATTENDANCE MATTERS.

Session 1 - UCAS

The aim of this session is to develop an understanding of the UCAS application process, learn the university jargon and discover what happens on results day.

Session 2 – Personal Statements

This is a practical session taking students through what is required for a personal statement. Students will then start to write their own.

Session 3 – How to choose a University

This session helps students with their choices of university. It asks students to think about what is important to them when choosing where to study. It will also encourage them to find open days to attend and think about what questions to ask.
