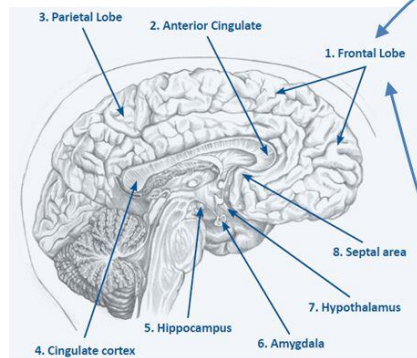

- Positive effects on the frontal lobe occur when we spend at least twelve minutes per day praying – *Ps 119:10-12*

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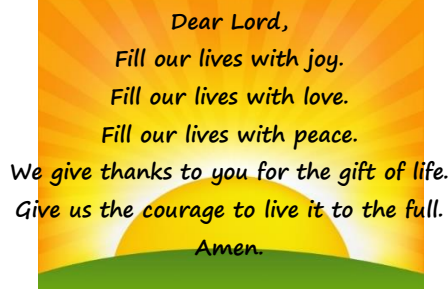

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Wednesday 1st February

Due to the strike action on Wednesday 1st February learning will take place online for pupils in year 7/8/9 and 10. Online learning will be provided via a mixture of live lessons, SAM Learning, Sparx Maths and The Everlearner. If your child's teacher is unavailable online then they should access SAM Learning, Sparx Maths or The Everlearner and complete tasks independently.

Students will need to also check MS Teams for instructions from teachers and/or log on to SAM Learning, Sparx Maths or The Everlearner to check for tasks set within these online platforms at the same time that they would have their normal lesson. SAM Learning's new artificial intelligence will also automatically set tasks based on previous learning to challenge students further. Teachers who are in school will be available on Teams during the normal timetabled lesson time if students have any questions or need any support with their learning.

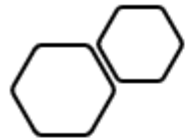
The infographic below and link shows how students can access learning and communicate with the school.

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Expectations of Students Learning From Home



Participate in the blended learning process

Attend timetabled sessions for live, recorded or tasks to complete
Complete independent work or work set by your teacher
Complete work on SAM Learning, Sparx Maths, The Everlearner or any other online platforms
Submit tasks promptly



Independent work tasks will include

Working through presentations and worksheets
Reading and making notes from textbooks and other electronic resources
Listening exercises, essays, coursework, practice questions or past exam papers
Working through exercises offered by external providers such as Sam Learning, Sparx Maths and The Everlearner



Read and respond to communications

Check your school email daily

Emails from class teacher, form tutor & pastoral leader
Check for communications via Teams daily



Live or recorded lessons

Link will be sent via Microsoft Teams for the lesson to take place during usual timetabled lesson time
